she transitioned to the United States Postal Service. There, she devoted 26 years of faithful service.

blessed with two children: Michail Carter and Meagan Carter. Her legacy also includes

her beloved grandson, the apple of her eye, Kambryn Myers. Her love for her family was unwavering.

She continued her spiritual journey at the Gospel of Christ Church in Jackson, Georgia.

She also became First Lady, at Oak Grove Holiness Church in Forsyth Georgia; where she
